As of July 1, 2025, hardworking Albertans are keeping more money in their pockets on every paycheque thanks to our new personal income tax cut and the introduction of a new tax bracket. "It's a cat," he told me, "but a truck ran over it "


Sometime later, Chris had made another simple animal shape, but Neil had a rather flat slab of dough on the table in front of him.





IMAGINE. EXPERIENCE. CELEBRATE. Powerhouse Vocals Incoming: AV & The Inner City Hits Camrose August 13!



"AV & the Inner City" is a soul/roots group that formed during the COVID19 pandemic and opioid crisis in the inner city of Edmonton, Canada.

The group is made up of 5 singers: band leader and multi award-winning singer-songwriter AV (Ann Vriend), Debbie Houle, co-founder of the Indigenous women's group, Asani; Crystal Eyo, lead singer and songwriter of Edmonton pop/RnB band, Mercy Funk; ESL teacher Alenka Lundell, who fronted and wrote songs for bands in her home country of Czech (formerly Czechoslovakia); and Jenn Dahlen, a guitar player, singer and clarinetist.

From April 2020 until October 2021, on every Sunday that the pandemic restrictions and weather would allow AV hosted and performed nearly 60 free concerts on her front porch in the inner-city neighborhood of McCauley, often with guests, including the 6 above mentioned

singers. The pandemic "porch concerts" were informal in nature but were a much-needed lifeline of music and social interaction for both performers and audience members alike, especially during some of the most restrictive pandemic periods, and in a place where there is a high population of people already quite cut off from a lot of opportunities and acceptance from the rest of society.

In the early summer of 2021, as small, outdoor concerts were allowed AV asked the group of singers that had been singing so often alongside her if they would be interested in forming an actual official, rehearsed act; the repertoire of which are her own songs, with a cover song or 2 thrown in for good measure, and 3 part harmony soul/gospel style arrangements based around her voice and keyboard playing. All the singers responded with an emphatic "Yes!", and thus "AV & the Inner City" was born.

Since then "AV & the Inner City" has performed at the Vancouver Island Music Festival, the Calgary Folk Music Festival, the Calgary International Blues Festival, the Edmonton Folk Music Festival where they received the Emerging Artist award; and, the Bear Creek Folk Festival.

In January 2024, the group recorded their debut single, Low and Lowly, and followed up that release with Music Always in May and Lion at the Gate in October. Their EP is due for release in early August of 2025.

In the meantime, the porch concerts are still well remembered and requested by many in the McCauley neighborhood and have served as a



continual way of strengthening ties of cooperation and positive camaraderie, so "AV & the Inner City" have committed to continue to perform at least 1 per year, pandemic or not.

And if you happen to be in McCauley you might hear their music blaring from a neighbor's speakers, or the singers practicing their harmonies in AV's well-known yard or on the front porch.

AV & the Inner City will be performing Wednesday, August 13 outside on the Verda McNeill Plaza at the Jeanne & Peter Lougheed Performing Arts Centre.

Can soft drinks, sports drinks and energy drinks fit into a healthy diet?

In looking for an alternative to sugar-laden sodas, many turn to sports drinks, energy drinks, and some of the newer "healthy" sodas. But are those beverages actually a better choice to wash down your lunch?

Traditional sports drinks were developed for a college football team practicing all day in the hot sun. They contain sugar, sodium, and more to replace what's lost in sweat during intense workouts. If you're not working out

intensely for hours, consider these drinks glorified sodas. A 20-ounce bottle of Gatorade provides the equivalent of 8 1/2 teaspoons of added sugar, just shy of the 9 3/4 teaspoons in a 12-ounce can of soda. Most have sugar-free options that use artificial sweeteners or sugar alcohols, but excessive amounts of those may contribute to digestive distress. Many energy drinks pose the same concerns.

When it comes to prebiotic sodas and the like, most actually contain far less added sugar and have a bonus of fiber and beneficial prebiotics. These specialized sodas and flavored sparkling waters could be a tasty alternative if you're looking for some bubbly sweetness in your drink.

Helpful hints: Keep some of these ideas in mind when choosing your next drink.

Can you drink just one? Some of these drinks provide two or more servings per bottle. If you down a full bottle in one sitting, be aware you may be getting more calories and sugar than you think.

Water it down. If you really want a sugar-sweetened drink, consider diluting it with water to cut sugar intake but still get some of that flavor.

Need a pick-me-up? Consider choosing a simple coffee and some fruit for healthy carbs and caffeine but not the potential 13-plus teaspoons of sugar from an energy drink.
